Verdi's *Requiem* is one of the most enduringly popular, colourful, passionate, exciting, dramatic and widely performed works in the whole choral-orchestral repertoire. He wrote it in memory of the poet Manzoni (d. 1873), including it in an elaborate setting of the *Libera me*, his own contribution to an earlier collaborative but unperformed Requiem for Rossini (d. 1868). Soloists and chorus are underpinned by a large orchestra, capable of considerable ferocity when unleashed.

Ticket concessions are available for students, senior citizens, registered unemployed and wheelchair users (with carer admitted free).

Thames Philharmonic Choir, founded in 1964, is well-known for high musical standards and for the pleasure it gives to performers and audiences alike. Based in south-west London, it performs locally, in central London and elsewhere in England and Europe.

Travel to Cadogan Hall

By Underground (Tube): Sloane Square underground station is two minutes' walk from Cadogan Hall. It is served by both District and Circle lines and is just one stop away from Victoria Station. Upon exiting Sloane Square tube, turn immediately right and you will see Cadogan Hall's clock tower before you.

By bus: numbers 11, 19, 22, 137, 211, 319, 360 and C1 stop in Sloane Square or neighbouring streets.
